Message from the Pastor

As you know, Laurie and I are in the midst of moving from our old home in Port Charlotte to our new location, somewhere in Citrus County. It is not an easy task; it is a lot of work; things get lost. Decisions need to be made, "Do we keep this?" "When was the last time we used this?" "Pitch it out!" Being sentimental needs to be kept in check, and being practical needs to be enhanced. The goal: to fit everything into an 8x16 foot box that will be moved to Citrus. In that box, we have placed precious pieces of furniture, clothing, and other select things that make a house a home.

That is, in some ways, how it is with our spiritual life. We need to keep our eye on the goal...heaven. We need to remove everything from our lives which prevents us from reaching this goal. It is good when those around us take a look in that box so that they can see what is truly special to us and what we deem as important. *Matthew* 5:29 *"If your right eye causes you to stumble, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into the fire."* Rather according to 1 *Tim.* 6, *"...put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment."*

May *God* enrich you with things that will provide you with those things necessary for you to reach your goal.
