Pastor's Message

Luke 2:21 On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise the child, he was named Jesus the name the angel had given him before he was conceived.

The church's new year began over a month ago, the first Sunday in Advent. Now, we celebrate the world's new year with two significant events: 1) the circumcision of the newborn king and 2) the giving to *God* incarnate the name Jesus.

Circumcision was commanded by *God* (*Gen. 17:11b*) as a physical sign of His covenant: it will be the sign of the covenant between me and you. *God's* covenant to Abraham was three fold: 1) Abraham would be a great nation; 2) His descendents would receive the promised land and 3) all people would be blessed through Abraham's special descendent.

The second celebration of the new year is the giving of the name to this special descendent: Jesus, meaning "He will save His people" or Savior.

Names have meanings. Have you ever looked up the meaning of your name? Mark means, "God of War". (Boy, does that explain a lot!) I have no idea why my parents named me Mark. I do not know of any other person for generations in my family named Mark. Did my parents call me Mark because they knew that I would by the God of War? Highly Doubtful.

However, when *God* announced the name of Jesus, *God* was giving meaning to 4,000 years of history. He will save His people. And, that is what He did. Jesus went through all of the commands of being human, including being circumcised into *God's* covenant with Abraham to dying for His people.

We begin our new year, 2020 knowing that this is going to be an important year to Tree of Life, to us and to *God*. We are His chosen, integrated into His new covenant. Christ is reigning on the throne of David forever and ever. We are His people serving Him where *God* places us.

May **God** bless us and keep us throughout 2020 and all the years to come according to His covenant of Grace.
